Being on the roll then gives you various entitlements when it comes to births, marriages and deaths and makes my life a lot easier when either you or your family come looking for a particular type of service.”

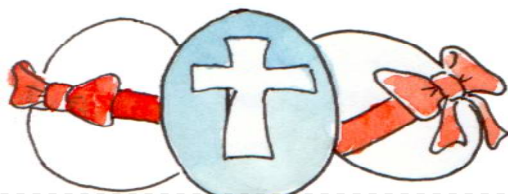
